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# After School Program for Youth with Special Needs

- An After School Program for Youth with Special Needs between the ages 13-21 whose parents require after school supports for employment purposes
- Starting in 2010, the program has grown from 2 to 12 sites and serves 78 youth from Sept-June
- Funded through the Manitoba's Children DisAbility Services (CdS) and Community Living DisAbility Services Departments (CLdS)







## Reason for the Evaluation

- Currently run as a respite service
- No best practices to draw from in terms of service delivery
- No previous documenting, monitoring, or evaluation

- 3. Is the program having the <u>intended impact</u>?




- 1. Who are the <u>leaders</u> in <u>inclusion support services</u> and what are the <u>best practices</u> for the <u>population served</u>?
  - <u>Leaders</u> Individuals, programs, community organizations/associations/institutions, and governments (cities/provinces) in program/policy development and delivery
  - <u>Inclusion support services</u> Specialized services that remove barriers and provide opportunities for youth living with disabilities to participate in a community setting in an active and meaningful way
  - <u>Best practices</u> Intervention/program/service/strategy that is most suitable given the available evidence for the particular situation/context (PHAC, Canadian Best Practices Portal)
  - <u>Population served</u> Youth 13-21 years old living with developmental or medical conditions that qualifies them to receive services through the "After School Program for Youth with Special Needs"

- Obiectives
  - Provide a wide range of social activities and learning experiences that encourage the development of selfconfidence
  - Build respectful, trusting relationships between youth, staff and peers
  - Provide a stimulating space with developmentally appropriate equipment and resources and a variety of developmentally appropriate experiences that foster cognitive, creative, social, emotional and physical development
  - · Create opportunities for youth to contribute to program planning
  - Provide information necessary for youth to make informed decisions
  - · Support an environment free from health and safety hazards
  - · Support independence in daily living skills and routines
  - Provide a safe environment for youth so that parents can pursue employment
  - · Provide ongoing opportunities for family involvement and input






#### 3. Is the program having the intended impact?
